The start of a new school year is always very exciting in the Music Department. Our theme this term is 'United We Stand' and classes have been exploring how we work together in music, through playing pieces such as 'O Fortuna' and 'Ode to Joy'. 'We are the Champions' is also proving to be a favourite! Our students on the access curriculum have been going on a river journey in their sensory theatre music sessions and some of our younger students have been singing songs about changes.

Our instrumental lessons have all started well, with many students continuing their lessons and some students having the opportunity to try a new instrument. This year we have new cello teacher Tom to welcome onto the team. There is always a waiting list for lessons but if students are interested please let us know as places can often become available over the course of the year. We have a system here of offering free lessons for students to try out an instrument and if they choose to continue these lessons are then privately funded.

Lunch time clubs are underway and accumulating good attendance. Our Afterschool clubs are going well too with Theatre Club with Chris being oversubscribed (again) this year and our Addington School Band who are already starting to rehearse for their first performance of the year in December!

Work Experience


This half term we have been working with the Education Business Partnership to set up extended work placements for a group of FE students who will be leaving school at the end of this academic year. The students are currently making decisions about the type of placement that they would most like to undertake. We try to ensure that these placements provide a great insight into the area of work that they are considering for the future.

Work Ready Days

Two classes have now undertaken visits to local companies to undertake work activities and to find out about the organisation and how it works. Kelly's class visited the Museum of Rural Life in Reading and William's class have visited Reading Buses. Both visits were very successful and have helped the students to gain an awareness of what is involved in running a business and the opportunities they provide.







National Grid

Our Supported Internship project with the National Grid has now come to fruition and the students have embarked on their first placement. It has been very exciting as well as a steep learning curve for us all. We have been really proud to see how well all of the students have started off, absorbing instructions, working as part of a new team and embracing the workplace with enthusiasm. There is a lot to learn but with the support of the job coaches and line managers, we hope that before too long they will be working confidently and independently.

Career's Fair

Some Key Stage 5 students visited the Wokingham Careers Fair at the Loddon Valley Leisure Centre. It was a wonderful opportunity to find out about local colleges and employers.
