The undoubted highlight of the event, which encapsulated the friendly spirit of the day, came during the ball shuttle race. An errant pass saw Arbour Vale's ball bounce over the rope into Addington's lane and Conor Lashbrook stopped mid-race to hand it back.

This term many students have been exploring 'Old and New' in music lessons, looking at how many new pieces of music take ideas from old. Our younger classes have been going on an 'Animal Adventure' in lessons and our access classes have been taking part in music about Viking stories.

The first part of the term was taken over by our whole school production of 'Oliver'. The performances were amazing and the music team is very proud of all of the students that took part. They worked really hard to learn words and songs and it all paid off with such a brilliant show.

We are now working towards our 'Superstar' concert. The choir has begun to rehearse songs that have been chosen by students from Addington, Brookfields and Kennel Lane schools and we are looking forward to performing together in June.

We held a training afternoon for teachers across Wokingham working with Key Stage 1 children. At the session lots of songs were introduced for schools to work towards for the Key Stage 1 singing morning in July. It was great to share resources with other teachers and encourage them to do more music!



Team Tempo, our senior rhythm group, have been out on tour again. They have performed at St. Nicholas primary school and Evendons primary school. They performed to the whole school and then worked with children in a workshop, where they helped them learn and create rhythms and play together. They have become an impressive group to listen to and now play at a really high standard. The schools we visited thoroughly enjoyed the concerts and practical sessions and gave lots of positive feedback.

We have started a project working alongside Berkshire Maestros for some of our younger children called Pantomimus. Groups are learning songs and dances and exploring imagination in weekly sessions.



We also enjoyed 2 days of workshops for our primary pupils with Alex from Kaya drumming. Alex led sessions in the tipi which was set up outside for all of our primary students. Unfortunately on the second day the rain was

too heavy to stay outside, but that didn't stop the fun of the sessions!

Key Stage 2 have also taken part in the third Arts Award week of the year. Along with exploring the arts through practical activities they enjoyed going to the Hexagon to watch 'Gangsta Granny.'

We are looking forward to a busy half term next half term – our Proms planning is well underway and as soon as the timetable is finalised we will let you know! During the week all children and young people perform with their class group, plus any instrumental lessons and clubs show the work they have been doing and we hope that parents will be able to come in and watch performances. **Proms weeks is 27th June – 1st July.**

WORK RELATED LEARNING

National Grid

The students are extremely busy at the moment consolidating their skills in their final placements. They are also working on the 'next step' of the project. They are currently working with the 'PerTemps' Recruitment agency as well as the Shaw Foundation to apply for jobs and update their cvs etc.

The prospective candidates for next year have now applied for places and the interviews will be held next month. It is hard to believe that we are nearing the end of the first year of this partnership and it seems to have gone so quickly. However, it has been the most amazing time for all those involved.

Horticulture

The group has been very busy this term. They have all been working hard on finishing their tasks for their accreditation. They have potted on hundreds of bedding plants and herbs. We sowed our tomato seeds in January and already have lots of tomatoes.

We are now in the process of sowing seeds and preparing the plots at the allotment. Hopefully there will be no more frosts.

The Horticulture group entered the 'Newbury 5 Challenges' for special schools The areas entered were:

A country garden collage

A homemade bughouse

A country craft

A country diary - a year in the life of a tree

Students from FE worked hard making all the exhibits including a super collage that won first prize. A great achievement



Hospitality

The young entrepreneur group also took part in the Newbury challenge. They entered the category 'A cookery class- something savoury with an animal theme.' They produced amazing food such as a ladybird made from tomatoes, cream cheese and olives presented on a spider pastry bed. Amazing!

The cafe continues to run very successfully. The students have worked hard to keep their '5 stars' and the group is working very well as a team. The first year students have been supported so well by the 2nd year group and it has been interesting to monitor how this mentoring programme has worked.



Work Experience

Some Key stage 4 students are currently participating in a block week, work experience.

This is the first time they have taken part in an off-site placement and it has mostly worked out extremely well.

It can be quite difficult to make the transition from working in school to working in an actual business.

Some students have had 1-1 support and some have worked independently. We have had some really lovely feedback from both employers and students.

They have been working in areas such as hospitality, sports retail and childcare. The placements provide a great experience for these students and enable them to start thinking about what they might like to do in the future.



Transitions

The Big lottery funding for the pre 16 Transition programme has now come to an end after 5 years. We have been very fortunate that the Education and Business Partnership have included us in their Transitions work. This has consisted of work experience, visits to and from local businesses and 'work ready' days helping to build social and work skills for the future. Our students have greatly benefitted from this work and the support and enthusiasm of the EBP staff. We are currently working with the EBP to work out an alternative programme for next year. We had an award evening in May to celebrate the progress of the students involved and to mark the end of the program.

At ground level, away from dizzying heights, we enjoyed Bush-craft, Nightline, Bottle-rocket making, Archery, Indoor Laser and a Pool session.

Everyone was supportive and encouraging, and celebrated each other's achievements. Every member of the group exhibited team work, enthusiasm and motivation, and was an exemplary ambassador for Addington.

The week taught us self-help and independence skills, and to look out for each other.

Friday saw a happy but rather tired group return with bags of washing for mums and dads to contend with.

The success of residential trips is due to the team effort and support of those who are left behind in school and the adults who go with our young people, to encourage and support them. A big thank you, to Jo Oldreive for having organised and made this trip possible, and to Ness, Amy, Rochelle and Luke for their support, during the week, in making the trip the success it was.
