# Horticulture

The current City and Guilds gardening group have worked well this term. Two of the students leaving to go to the National Grid, have achieved their Certificates, gaining 24 credits each. A third student who is leaving to go to college has achieved his Award with 6 credits. The remaining 3 students will continue with the course and, hopefully, achieve the full Diploma.

The 3 Bulmershe students, who have been working with some of our students on Thursday mornings, will be joining us again next year and working towards the City and Guilds qualification.

We sowed our tomatoes in January so that they were ready before the summer holidays and we have already had lots of ripe tomatoes.

We are hoping that the slugs will leave us some runner beans as they have eaten almost everything else as soon as we have planted it at the allotment. Next year we intend to come up with a safe but deadly deterrent!

We are slightly more hopeful with the crops being grown in school- carrots, sweetcorn, lettuce, onions, broccoli, pumpkins, runner beans, peppers, herbs and courgettes.

Our bedding plants did well this summer; the students are very pleased with the tubs and containers they planted up around school.

Lots of students took home plants that they had grown on from tiny plugs.

# **Hospitality**

The Young Entrepreneurs are now coming to the end of their year running the café at Shute End, and it has been a really successful one. Alongside gaining invaluable work and independence skills, all 6 students have completed their City and Guilds Hospitality accreditation. The café has provided a real life working environment and we have seen all the students develop great skills in working together as a team, taking individual responsibility and also catering skills such as making snacks and hot drinks. We were so pleased to see how each of the students matured and developed soft skills such as gaining confidence and self- esteem. We believe that the experience our students gain at the café can also support their job applications. One of the members of the group has now undertaken a weekend job in one of the local cafes, and her employer noted and commented about her cafe experience that she had included in her CV!

We have been really pleased that the Chief Executive of Wokingham Borough Council has taken a great interest in the development of the café over the last 2 years, and has developed a really good rapport with the group. They invited him to school on the 25<sup>th</sup> June to see how they prepare the food for the café. He stayed for an hour and a half and took a great interest in their Hospitality folders and observing all the hard work involved in the process.

# National Grid

The students are extremely busy at the moment consolidating their skills in their final placements and working towards future employment opportunities and college placements.

Recently, we have been working alongside the National Grid, organising and running the application and interview process for next year's supported internship programme. We are really pleased that 5 of our students have been accepted on to next year's programme. Their parents and carers have had the opportunity to meet the National Grid staff and to have a tour of the building. All the parents were very impressed by the Power Point presentations that our current interns gave about their year at the 'Grid'.

We have been delighted and amazed with the progress this first group of students have made both in their work ethic and maturity and we have great hopes that some will be offered paid employment in the very near future. We are looking forward to building on the success of our partnership with the NG and to widening and developing our links over the coming year.

# Work Related Learning

This half-term, we have had a group of 5 students carry out some work shadowing at Wokingham Borough Council. This was a great opportunity to see at first- hand how some of the council departments function, and gave an insight into the working life of different employees. The staff at the council are always very supportive and work very hard to give our students a valuable experience. They worked across different departments such as the Children's team, Waste and Recycling, Sports and Leisure and Business Management. They had a great morning at Reading Football Club where they found out how many different departments are necessary to run their business.

We are hosting our 'Celebration Assembly' this half term where we will celebrate the success of all our students who have taken part in the 'Transitions', and also those who have taken part in the Work Related learning programme
