
All these awards were given for a combination of excellent play and also great teamwork and spirit.

National Grid

We were really proud watching each student standing up and speaking so confidently at such an event! Everyone involved in the programme has been really delighted to see how they have all grown in confidence and also the amount of new work skills that they have developed!

Next term 2 of the students are staying in the same departments, although working on different targets and the other 3 students are moving to new areas.

The students all worked very hard organising a very successful 'Christmas Fair'. They raised an amazing sum of £700 which the NG matched and this was donated to the 'Alzheimer's' charity. They worked extremely hard, researching possible stall holders and inviting a good, cross-section of businesses. They contacted local businesses for raffle prizes and liaised with NG departments and site control. They also invited 2 classes from Addington to sell items they had made in Business Enterprise.

We were very proud of all their efforts, especially their organisational skills and their superb communication with everyone involved.
