Many of our students in FE also completed blocks of Work Experience in various businesses within the local community, as well as running the café at Shute End. I have introduced a weekly Headteacher Award for each Key Stage where 1 pupil is congratulated on an aspect of their development, no matter how small, during an assembly. 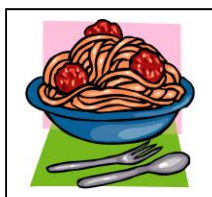

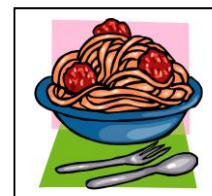

WORK RELATED LEARNING

The Interns

Our students at National Grid have completed a successful half-term in their supported internships. Two of the students have acquired new tasks in the job placements that carried over from the previous term. Having settled well, and established themselves within their teams they are striving to become even more independent with their roles and responsibilities. The other three students have embraced new challenges in their moves to different placements within National Grid. Moving out of their comfort zones, the interns have adapted extremely well to the new job roles and new team colleagues, as well as adding to their skills set in their career progression.

Inspirations Week

This term, the current National Grid interns from Addington have also become role-models for the future interns from Addington School. Led by their job coaches, the interns provided presentations on the Inspirations Day attended by a group of FE students. The Addington students took part in a day of team building, fact-finding and communication development planned by staff from the National Grid graduates programme.

During Inspirations Week FE students have explored how emergency situations are communicated between services, acted upon and investigated. At Iver Environmental Centre students had the opportunity to explore environmental concerns attached to industry. Students visited Didcot to explore a live site involved with the transportation and management of energy. Discovering a world of work that is very different from the school environment, our FE students have had the most wonderful experiences that will broaden their skills and qualities as they approach adulthood.



Work Experience

Extended Work Placements

Congratulations to the students who took part in work experience job interviews with a range of companies around Berkshire. Having had successful interviews, students were offered positions and had an opportunity to meet with their employers and line managers before taking up their placements.



Applying skills taught in the classroom, Addington students are enjoying work experience in a range of businesses, including Marks & Spencer in Reading, Emma's Kitchen in Twyford, Pudding Lane Garden Centre in Arborfield, the Cow Shed in Henley, Central Business Partnership in Winnersh Triangle, Café Piazza and the town council in Woodley. Several students are travelling independently to work, or engaging in travel training to become independent.



Hospitality

The FE Hospitality students have had an intensive term of assessments. Having spent the winter term perfecting their basic skills in Hospitality, the students successfully completed a range of modules towards their Level 1 qualification. The proof of their improving culinary skills continues to be reflected in the success of the young entrepreneur's café at Wokingham Borough Council. Despite New Year diets, the sandwiches and baked goods at Shutters have continued to sell-out. Students are learning to manage their time, improve their money skills, work as a team, and to remain calm in busy situations as their business venture continues to attract a large number of customers.



Horticulture

The Horticulture groups have been working hard mulching, raking up leaves and weeding around the school grounds. We haven't been able to work outside as much as last year, due to the hard frost. The students have been using their time indoors to work on their entries for the Newbury Challenge, which takes place on 27th April. We are entering two teams this year.

Our chosen categories are: A country craft, students have made a felted acorn garland; a garden themed board game, still in progress- lots of boards designed & now working on packaging; a collage of the seaside, 2 very different pictures in progress; a calendar with photographs from the school garden; a birdfeeder made from recycled materials, one from string covered tins and the other from a recycled umbrella and lots of painted bottles; a home-grown herb planter and something cooked which has chocolate in the ingredients.

Meanwhile, our potatoes are chitting, the garlic and onions are planted and our early broad-bean crop is looking healthy. We are all looking forward to next term so that we can start outdoor sowings and begin our hanging basket production!



Work Ready Days

FE students have had an industrious start to this half-term with a range of Work Ready Days with local companies. At Baxter Storey students had the chance to explore jobs that link to the skills and qualities they have developed in Hospitality and Food Technology. They discovered the ways in which the food service industry has grown and developed in recent years, as well as aspects of food hygiene that impact on day-to-day business.

Students have also visited 'Dog Trouble' in Wokingham to learn about the skills and qualities needed to work with animals. It was a wonderful opportunity for students to explore different aspects of the pet industry, including grooming, animal behaviour, pet training, kennelling and general animal care.



Having completed a Health and Safety module in their Employability qualification, a group of students experienced first-hand the ways in which Health and Safety is used to minimise risk on a building site. Following a safety briefing at Balfour Beatty's Wokingham office, students were provided with Personal Protective Equipment before visiting the Carnival Pool building project. It was a really interesting day, and provided great insight for the students of the different job opportunities that are available in the construction industry.
