Dear Parents and Carers

Looking back now to my Christmas newsletter, it was only a day later that our area was put into tier 4 and Christmas for extended families was effectively cancelled! This was swiftly followed by our 3rd lockdown which I fervently hope is due to end in a few weeks' time. For our pupils, families and staff this has been our toughest period yet, without the advantageous weather of the first lockdown, and with daily grim news of infection rates and deaths, I acknowledge what a huge struggle this has been for everyone in our Addington community.

However, out of these difficult times have come some wonderful stories: of home learning, of teachers and families working together, of staff providing high quality on site provision, of parents and carers sharing the learning that is happening at home on Earwig, of live lessons and assemblies to unite pupils at home and at school and last, but definitely not least, the weekly Addington show that highlights all of the above.

I would like to thank all our families for working with us to ensure that education has continued for our children and young people. I understand how difficult it can be to juggle the demands of home schooling, your own working from home and the demands of a child with special needs. My thanks also to the dedicated staff that have either provided home learning or have come into school to educate key worker children and our most vulnerable children. We have managed to stay relatively safe with very few positive Covid-19 cases, illustrating our risk reduction measures are working as much as they possibly can. I hope the pages of this newsletter showcase some of the exciting activities that have been available despite the circumstances we are in, many of which contain food – I wonder why!

As we begin half term, I am expecting announcements to come from the government regarding the plan for the next few weeks and all indicators so far show there is an expectation that schools will re-open from **8th March**. As we all know by now, until the announcement is made, things are never definite but I would suggest families prepare for a return to full time school from this date. As soon as there is certain guidance I will inform parents as quickly as possible. In the meantime, the home learning/ onsite offer will continue as is after half term.

I hope everyone has a safe, enjoyable half term and that I get to say hello to all our pupils face to face before I write again at Easter.


School Dinners



We are happy to say that we are able to start Rebound Therapy again on the trampoline after the Covid 19 lockdown started after Christmas. Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award 2020-2021



Any face-to-face lessons have stopped for our Bronze Award students but, as with our new Silver participants, we are managing a once-per-week virtual tutorial during which we can offer support and advice on the team's Physical, Skills and Volunteering elements along with some teaching. This half-term we have covered recording evidence, the expedition aim, meal preparation and the use of the stove on expedition and we made some bird feeders. Hopefully the birds appreciated them during the snowy conditions outside. Despite the damp winter weather, the students are being encouraged to get out walking and cycling and litter-picking in their local areas.



Duke of Edinburgh Silver Award 2020-2021





For the first time Addington has registered 6 students for the Duke of Edinburgh Silver Award. All have already completed their Bronze Awards with distinction and are enthusiastic for the stronger challenges that the Silver Award brings. Of course, we have not been able to have any face-to-face meetings but we have set up regular once-per-week virtual lessons for the Silver Team during which the students discussed what their aim will be and what types of food they can cook for their breakfast and evening meals on their expedition. They are also starting to consider what they will be doing for their Physical, Skills and Volunteering elements. Lockdown is also making this challenging too! The Silver Award puts more emphasis on independence and it is physically tougher too, with two nights camping and 3 days walking on expedition.


We wanted to say a huge thank you for all of your support and please remember you are all doing a brilliant job at home. Please let us know if we can support you any more at home.

Primrose Class





Lily Class have been reading the stories 'The 3 Little Pigs', 'A Squash and a Squeeze' and 'Kitchen Disco' at school and at home this term. We have enjoyed acting out the stories and doing lots of different activities based around the theme of 'Homes'. We cut out shapes to make houses and learnt about the animals in the stories. 
Key Stage 2 Newsletter



Lime Class have also been having lots of fun at home, joining in lessons over Teams and exploring our local communities during daily walks. Well done everyone!





Apple Class

Beech Class




Poppy Class

Aspen Class







Chestnut Class






Maple Class

Key Stage 4

Swan Class News

Food

Our topic this term is Food. In Science we have been conducting food experiments with bicarbonate of soda and cornflour, as well as looking at the viscosity of different substances. We tasted foods to see if they were sweet, sour, salty or spicy. It was very funny seeing the students' faces on Teams when we asked them to taste a piece of lemon! This week we have been freezing liquids such as ketchup and washing up liquid to see which ones froze the best and melted the quickest. In Literacy we have analysed food adverts and designed a few of our own. We designed our own chocolate bar and wrote about our choices of ingredients. In Art with Jules we made our own Planet Earth Pictures and Pizza plates. Students in class made a Chinese style Plum Blossom painting. In Maths we have worked on time and money – particularly food prices. We looked at food labels, use by dates on food and weights.



For life skills we have looked at food safety and hygiene, fridge filling and food labels as well as recycling and plastics. Our students were even challenged to sort out the tins cupboard at home and bring all items with a shorter date to the front. Many of our students at home have been developing their independence skills by undertaking a range of tasks around the house.





Teams Calls

We have daily Teams call at 11am each morning which bring together Swan Class students to meet up and learn together. As well as weekly news, lessons and home learning support we have set up a wide range of 'Guest Appearances'. This is where specialist teaching staff are invited to do a 20-minute session – we have had music quizzes from Sean, Drama lessons from Carla, PSHE sessions from Danny, Wellbeing and Happiness from Simone, Art lessons from Jules, Science and Maths lessons from Julie, Work Skills with Stacey and Kim, PE and Outdoor Learning lessons from Mel as well as online bingo. Our students are all very engaged in these sessions and have become very proficient at logging on, using the chat function and some students have become 'teachers' and presented their own PowerPoint presentations on-line to the class.

Wellbeing and PE

Students have taken part in a wide range of wellbeing activities and PE over the term. As well as live PE sessions run by Mel and Danny, students are encouraged to go for a walk or take exercise every day. As part of Children's Mental Health week students made a calming jar during a live Teams session led by Simone on Wellbeing. They thought about kindness and the importance of not only being kind to others but also being kind to themselves. This week they made Calm Boxes following an on-line demonstration from Simone.



Kite and Swan Cooking


Each week the students in Key Stage 4 have undertaken a 'Weekly Cooking Challenge'. 
Kite class news





and at home – looking forward to when we can re-open our wonderful 6th form café 'The Nest'.






Being creative and doing the things we enjoy have helped with our wellbeing whether we are in school, at home or a mixture of both...


