### **School Dinners**

This is to inform you that all school lunches must now be paid for online. The school will no longer be able to collect cash on a daily basis.

If your child has school dinners, and there is a balance outstanding on your account, we would be grateful if you would kindly clear this balance as soon as possible.

If you have any query or difficulty with payment of this amount, please let us know and we will endeavour to help.

You will need to register online if you have not done so before. A letter with your personal log on details has been sent home with your child. If you have previously logged on to the Tucasi system but have forgotten your password, please follow the instructions on the login screen.

### Free school meals and extra funding for your child's education

Please see message below from Wokingham Borough Council about eligibility to claim for free school meals. Even if your child already gets free school meals due to their age (Pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 now qualify automatically for free school meals), if you qualify for one of the benefits listed below it is important to make an application for free school meals as your child will then qualify for extra funding for their education. More information can be found on the <u>free school meals page on the school website</u>.

Across the UK more than 10 per cent of pupils who are eligible for free school meals do not register to get them.

We want to make sure 100 per cent of our pupils claim when they can in Wokingham Borough. Importantly, it also means schools can get additional funding to support pupils.

To qualify, your child must be in school and you must be receiving one of the following benefits:

- Income support
- Income based <u>Job Seekers Allowance</u>
- Income related <u>Employment and Support Allowance</u>
- NASS support
- Guarantee element of State Pension
- <u>Child Tax Credit</u>, provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit for the four weeks after employment ends
- <u>Universal Credit</u>, provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400

If this applies to you but your child isn't registered for free school meals, complete a form and return it to your child school.



# **CAR PARKING REMINDER**

Thank you to all parents who drop off and/or pick up their child from school for continuing to work with us to make our car park run as smoothly as possible. I have been actively monitoring the car park regularly over the last month and in general it is running smoothly. Below are reminders of key points to help maintain this.



To ensure the continued smooth and safe operation of the busy Addington car park

we need all parents who drive their child to school to park in the Bulmershe Leisure Centre car park and walk across the zebra crossing, during drop off/pick up times. We have an agreement in place with Bulmershe Leisure Centre to allow this our parents to park in their car park for 30 minutes during pick up and drop off times. The car park will be monitored by a leisure centre employed car parking attendant. We will work with the leisure centre to try and foster an empathetic and supportive approach to managing the car park to try and avoid any unnecessary distress for our parents.

We do recognise that for a small minority of pupils crossing the road will not be possible. Therefore, a limited number of parent passes, allowing access to our car park, are distributed based on an individual's agreed needs; physical, emotional or behavioural.

If you feel you need a car park pass please let your class teacher know, including the reason for needing one. A member of SLT will then allocate a pass or contact you for further discussion/information.

We only have a small number of spaces for parents in our car park, so we will not always be able to give out passes to all parents who would like one.

#### Parents with Passes using the Addington School Car Park

- Parents with passes must only park in the allocated bays near the main entrance and not in the main body of the car park where staff park, unless specific arrangements have been made with a member of the leadership team. This is especially important in the morning as some staff start at 9 and sometimes cannot find a parking space.
- Car park passes must be displayed clearly in the windscreen. The two disabled bays near the school are for priority wheelchair users and larger vehicles with tail lifts. Permitted drivers must use the one-way system marked out and only park in marked parent or disabled spaces.
- Unfortunately at busy times we do not have enough parking spaces onsite for all parents with passes. **Please work with our staff** as they manage these situations as efficiently as possible, this is likely to involve being asked to complete one or more circuits of the car park to ensure the car park flow is not disrupted.
- Parents can move the cones on the parent parking and disabled bays in the area near the main entrance, however if there is a cone with a sign on it, only move this if it has been allocated to you. Cones with signs on are to reserve spaces for a particular pupil with a specific need.

### **General instructions**

- All pedestrians must use the zebra crossings and the pavement when walking around the school car park or to and from the site. **DO NOT WALK** on the road as a short cut. This is very dangerous and could result in an accident.
- Parents or carers must not park in the old entrance to Addington (near Bulmershe Leisure Centre) or on the double yellow lines near our old entrance, to drop off or pick up.
- Please leave parking spaces promptly To support the process at the start and end of day to run smoothly, please can I ask that all parents and carers vacate parking spaces in either of the car parks as soon as possible to allow other parents access to the space. If you need to have a discussion with the teacher, please arrange a time to meet in person or have a telephone conversation to free up a parking space as soon as possible.

# **Therapy Update**

We have a fantastic therapy team, comprising of Addington specialist staff and NHS professionals. This team works alongside class staff to plan and deliver our integrated therapeutic curriculum. Here are updates to changes within the team.

We have some new therapists that have joined the Addington and CYPIT teams.

### **Occupational Therapy**



We would like to welcome Victoria who has recently joined the team at Addington as an Independent Occupational Therapist. She will be working alongside our Therapy Support Assistants two days a week. Victoria will be focusing on delivering a universal level of provision including class training on universal strategies/ environmental adaptations, supporting integration of these strategies into class routines and signposting to relevant agencies. The Children and Young Person's Integrated Therapy Team (CYPIT) will continue to be responsible for delivering specialist level care for pupils whose needs cannot be met through the universal provision including individualised assessments and therapy

programmes. CYPIT also have a wealth of universal resources on their website for parents/ care givers to access under the health & development tab covering a wide range of topics including sensory processing, independence and motor skills. <u>https://cypf.berkshirehealthcare.nhs.uk/</u>

Lottie and Jason have joined us as our CYPIT allocated OTs. Along with providing on-going support to class teams they are also assessing and reviewing students with a CYPIT referral.

### Speech and Language

After Easter we unfortunately do not have CYPIT allocated Speech and Language therapists, due to staff moves. However, we continue to have our SALT assistant Louise and our communication HLTA Sarah to ensure that students are being supported effectively. CYPIT will be providing regular cover to ensure that any referrals are assessed and are still able to advise and support staff.





# **After School Sports Club**

This half-term the after school sports club pupils have been working on their fitness levels. They have tested their fitness levels running the Bleep and Cooper run tests. They have also participated in fitness circuits.









# Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award 2023-2024

This half-term, the boys in the Bronze DofE group have been going offsite to practise their walking and navigational skills. # **Daisy Class**

# **Primrose Class**

# **Bluebell Class**

We have had another great term in Bluebell Class. Our topic this term has been Changes. In Communication, Language and Literacy we have been looking at the stories 'Mr Wolf's pancakes', 'Jasper's Beanstalk' and 'we're going on an egg hunt'. The children also enjoyed learning about the Wizard of Oz on World Book Day. In cooking, we have been making pasta bake, chocolate Easter nests and fudge to celebrate Holi! In Maths we have enjoyed exploring number and shape, space and measure through Bucket- the children are working towards Stage 4! The children have really enjoyed learning about weight through water and food play.

The children have been working really hard on their 'use of tools' skills in Waldon. In PE lessons, the children have been doing rebound, all the children love jumping around on the trampoline! The children have also really enjoyed learning the 'p' sound in Phonics.



# **Daffodil Class**

This half term Daffodil Class have been working on their understanding of the world through developing their knowledge of the days of the week / what the differences are on these days relating to our class timetable. We have also really enjoyed taking care of our caterpillars and watching them grow and change over the half term, we are hoping to release them as butterflies at the end of term!

We have been exploring different toys to expand our play experiences and develop our turn taking and attention skills. Our favourites have been the sensory items and K-Nex which has been great for developing our creativity skills and sharing ideas with peers.

A big focus for us this half term has been developing our pre-writing shapes and handwriting. Using playdoh has been great to warm up our fine motor muscles and get our hands ready for handwriting and develop our hand eye co-ordination.



# Hedgehog Class

Hedgehog class have had a great half term! We have been continuing to learn about changes and have been looking at how things grow. At the start of the half term we planted our own sunflower seeds and have been looking after them and watching them grow.

We also had a visit from the chicks. The children enjoyed seeing the chicks – they were very curious of the chicks and some children were even brave enough to stroke them. After we saw the chicks, we all joined in with a chicken themed sensology where we listened to some chickens, stroke some feathers, smelt and tasted some boiled eggs, and ate some mini eggs.



# **Sunflower Class**

This term we have continued to explore the topic of Changes, and have welcomed some special visitors into the classroom- our caterpillars! The children have loved watching the caterpillars change over time, and learnt about the life cycle of the caterpillar, through stories and sensory play. We've also continued to explore the life cycle of a sunflower, and planted our own sunflowers and watched them grow. At the start of term, we enjoyed some late celebrations for Pancake Day and the children loved exploring making and decorating our own pancakes, choosing their own toppings using PECS and communication boards. Another highlight of this term has been our Easter Stay and Play, with our parents joining us for fun Easter activities, including an Easter egg hunt outside! It was a wonderful event and the children really enjoyed having their parents join them for the session. Everyone has continued to work on their communication, independence and play skills across the term and we're so proud of how well everyone is doing. We hope everyone has a lovely Easter break and look forward to seeing everyone back after the holiday!



# **Squirrel Class**

This term the children in Squirrel class have had lots of fun playing and engaging in a variety of explore based play opportunities. Many of the students showed a real enjoyment of our stories this term, particularly 'We're Going on an Egg Hunt!'. The children listened to and responded positively to our touch talk story based on this book, showing eye contact, making vocalisations and using body language to request more or more of particular movements.

This half term, we have continued to explore the changes in our environment as we move into spring. Many of the students were highly motivated and curious when the chicks came to visit us at the Early Years Centre. Some of the pupils showed confidence and willingness to have a go at something unfamiliar, like gently stroking the chicks too!

In the lead up to the Easter holidays, we have been engaging in play focused around celebrations and festivals celebrated by our pupils and families. The children thoroughly enjoyed many of their families coming for a 'Stay and Play' session celebrating Easter and Holi festival.

#### Project – Fast fashion

In students continued project work centred on the theme of 'Fast Fashion', students have embarked on a comprehensive exploration of various aspects within the fashion industry: **Exploration of Fashion History**: Students delved into the rich history of fashion, examining its evolution through different eras.

**Understanding Clothing Production**: A key focus has been understanding the process of clothing manufacture, including insights into sizing standards and production methods. **Online Retail**: An exploration of online retail platforms has equipped students with knowledge about purchasing clothes on the internet.

**Luxury Items and Pricing**: Discussions around luxury fashion items have provided insights into the market, including pricing structures and materials used.

In preparation for the end-of-term fashion show, students directed their creativity towards designing personalised white t-shirts. This exercise allowed them to explore diverse styles and express their unique artistic visions.

As part of a community engagement initiative, students undertook a challenge to assemble outfits from local charity shops. Swan class worked as a team and collated an outfit with a budget of £20, encouraging resourcefulness and creativity.



#### Work Ready Days

Students attended the MERL Museum in Reading. Students travel trained to the museum where they were given a tour of the museum, completed a quiz, looked at different fabrics that are used to make clothes and watched a video which was created by the students at the University of Reading.



#### Life Skills – Home management

This term, students have been focusing on Home management to support independence. Students have been learning how to pair socks, fold trousers and shirts, put clothes on hangers, wet clothes on a clothes airer, use a washing machine, put up an ironing board and iron clothes correctly and safety.

### **Preparation for Adulthood**

This has been a very busy half-term for our preparation for adulthood team as well as our students from Key Stage 4 up. Over this term our students have had over 150 workplace encounters! This is more than ever before. This has been a mixture of whole class work ready days at the likes of Pizza Express, Try a Train, Museum of English Rural Life to name a few as well as individual work experience across hospitality, horticulture, libraries, retail etc.



Our work ready days are generally whole class trips where our students get the opportunity to go to an employer site to learn about the jobs that people do, get an insight into what it is like to be in a real work place, sometimes they will even do some hands on tasks like pizza making.

We give many of our 6<sup>th</sup> form students the opportunity to go and do work experience where they generally go to the same employer once a week for a minimum of 6 weeks. This is always supported initially and then depending on the student the support is tapered. We have so many success stories from this half-term where we've seen students grow in confidence, learn new skills, engage with new people and some are now even travelling independently to work.



The highlight of the project was a fashion show where every student took to the catwalk to display their creative skills. Travel and town training, and staying safe in the community is always given importance and practised when we are in the wider community.

After an eventful spring term, a well-deserved break is looked forward to when, once again, everyone can recharge their batteries in readiness for another even busier summer term ahead.




### Horticulture
