
Happy Easter to you all! However you spend or celebrate this time of year, I hope that you have a restful time and that there are happy memories made.

Lily Class have been celebrating themselves and their families during assemblies each week. The highlight this term was the workshop from Keith Parks, teaching call



UPPER SCHOOL


